- ➤ Sidewalks/Trail for 49/Sharpsburg is still in planning mode
- > Safe Routes to school application for grant is due in March
- ➤ Water Plant study needs upgraded, funding options
- Looking for a Utility Superintendent to fill a vacancy on the staff
- Issue 2 concerns with dispensary in town, likely going to make a motion to make them illegal in town.
